The Bride's Checklist

12 Months Before Wedding

1. Select a wedding consultant to help you avoid wasting time or money.
2. Confirm the ceremony date, time, and site.
3. Set a preliminary budget.
4. Select the attendants.
5. Reserve the reception site.
6. Select and book the caterers, photographers, videographers, florists, musicians, and any other service providers.
7. Begin compiling the guest list.
8. Start shopping for the wedding dress, headpiece, and bridesmaids' dresses.
9. Start thinking about your Honey-moon!
10. Adopt healthy eating habits. Remember your insides reflect on the outside. Increase your fresh fruit and vegetable intake. Buy organic whenever available. Follow the color scheme. Try to have a variety of colors when choosing your fruits. The more vibrant the color, the richer the nutrients.
11. Increase your omega-3 intake, found in foods as varied as flax seeds, soybeans, salmon, halibut, sardines, spinach, eggs, and olive oil, to name just a few.
12. Minimize white bread, white rice, potatoes and sugar. Sugar is found to have great effect on aging of the cells.
13. Drop the preservatives and the additives. Try to keep the food you consume as natural as possible. Get a fruit juicer and experiment with fresh fruits and vegetables, such as apples, oranges, carrots, berries, avocados.

14. Add grains to your diet.
15. Have oatmeal for breakfast twice a week, but not the fast cooking type.
16. Minimize your caffeine intake. Drink white, black, or green teas instead of coffee, and increase your water intake.

9 Months Before Wedding

1. Choose and order your dress and all accessories.
2. Shop for a new home.
3. Get shaped and toned. Maintain a regular exercise schedule.
4. Reduce stress as much as you can by joining a yoga class, learning some relaxation techniques, walking outdoors and most importantly socializing with friends who give you positive energy and boost your morale.
5. Visit your favorite spa and discuss with them a set of facials, treatments and massages.
6. Visit your dermatologist. Address your skin problems and start working on them. Ask about getting facial peels; they help you get healthy, glowing, and flawless skin.
7. Get a model-perfect smile. Visit your dentist to get rid of any decay, clean, and polish your teeth. If you need to whiten your teeth, it's the right time to start now. There are several methods available. Ask around and decide which technique best suits your needs.

6 Months Before Wedding

1. Place deposits and sign contracts for your wedding services.
2. Choose the bridesmaids' dresses and accessories.
3. Choose the flower girls' dresses.
4. Make sure your visas and passports are up to date, if you're traveling.
5. Complete the honeymoon plans with the groom.
6. Discuss the pre-wedding parties with the groom.

4 Months Before Wedding

1. Verify that the wedding gown, bridesmaids' dresses, and flower girl dresses have been ordered.
2. Make sure the addresses for the guest list are up to date.
3. Order the invitations.
4. Choose and order the formal wear of the groom and bestman.
5. Verify that both mothers have selected and ordered their dresses.
6. Investigate the requirements for acquiring your marriage license.
7. Complete gift registry.
8. Shop for trousseau.



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3 Months Before Wedding

1. Book an appointment with your hairdresser. Set dates for trials and ask a friend along and take photos to help you decide what suits you best. Discuss color, trims, and treatments to ensure healthy, glossy hair. Don't do anything dramatic with your hair at the last minute!
2. Visit several makeup artists until you find one you feel comfortable with. Discuss looks, styles, and color schemes. Decide on what part of your face you would like to emphasize: your eyes or your lips. Avoid stressing both as it will make you look too done up.
3. Set dates for makeup trials and take photos.
4. Book weekly manicures and pedicures. Moisturize your hands and feet more often than usual.

2 Months Before Wedding

1. Schedule the final dress fitting.
2. Confirm the ceremony details with your planner.
3. Finish addressing invitations and announcements.
4. Finalize pre-wedding parties and honeymoon.
5. Shop for gifts for the bridal party.
6. Shop for accessories such as shoes, stockings, a garter, a cake knife, candles, and a guest book.
7. Choose wedding rings and arrange for the engraving.
8. Schedule an appointment with your hairdresser and make-up consultant.
9. Finalize and verify all details with your service providers.
10. Order the wedding cake.

6 Weeks Before Wedding

1. Mail invitations.
2. Set up a rehearsal and inform all who needed to be there.
3. Make the final menu decisions.
4. Discuss your wedding photo shots with photographer and videographer.

1 Month Before Wedding

1. Get your makeup and hair rehearsals done. Try to opt for more subdued and classical colors and styles as they will remain timeless in the pictures.
2. Get a sugar or wax appointment. Book another one 3 days before the wedding.
3. Final touches on hair: color highlights or trims.
4. Work on your posture.
5. Get as much rest and sleep as you can.
6. Make a list of things you want to take with you on honeymoon.
7. Make sure all your accessories are ready.

2 Weeks Before Wedding

1. Pick up your wedding gown and confirm that it fits properly.
2. Take care of your marriage license.
3. Finalize musical selections for ceremony and reception.
4. Finalize the seating chart for the dinner.
5. Confirm details with all service providers.



1 Week Before Wedding

1. Pick up the wedding rings.
2. Give the final guest count for the reception to your caterer.
3. Discuss what type of makeup you would like to have for your wedding with your make up artist and try out a test run.
4. Verify all bridesmaids and groomsmen have picked up their formal wear.
5. Confirm that all attendants know when to arrive at the pre-wedding parties and the wedding ceremony.
6. Confirm your honeymoon plans.
7. Pay up-coming bills that will be due while you're away.
8. Pack for your honeymoon and purchase traveler's checks.
9. Arrange to move belongings to your new home.
10. Finalize your hair and makeup look. Don't hesitate to express yourself if you're not satisfied with anything.
11. Deep condition your hair.
12. Get a light massage.
13. Go for your sugar or wax appointment.
14. Early this week, finalize your peels or facials. You don't want blotchy skin, so avoid having any close to the date.
15. Avoid dairy food and fizzy drinks, as they cause bloating.
16. A day before your wedding have your manicure and pedicure.



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1 - 2 Days Before Wedding

1. Review any special seating arrangements with the ushers.
2. Ensure that the groom has picked up his suit.
3. Make sure you have your marriage license.
4. Check all final details with the caterer, florist, musicians, etc..

The Night Before Wedding

Sleep, sleep, sleep - you have the biggest day of your life ahead of you. You want to look and feel your best. Make sure to make time with your family, especially your parents, in order to share memories of times gone by and to say thank you. Next, take photos of your hours at home as a single person. Take some time for yourself to unwind. Close your eyes and visualize every step of the coming day. This will relax you and help you prevent any unforeseen incidents.

The Morning of the Big Day

The day you have been waiting for has finally arrived! You have been dreaming of this moment all your life. Today, you are the princess, so get up and celebrate your new life, celebrate your happiness.

1. Have breakfast. Very important!
2. Do your hair.
3. Do your makeup.
4. Put a top coat on your nails.
5. Put on a smile, remember your posture, and walk with confidence.

Most importantly stay calm; if you run behind schedule take a deep breath and remember that the ceremony will wait for you! Remember that mishaps are bound to happen, so don't get worked up about them. People will probably not notice them. The thing that people remember after the wedding is the

couple's attitude.

Looking, feeling, and radiating your happiness are what count.

Countdown to the Ceremony

3 hours: The groom and best man get together to begin dressing.

2 hours: The groom's family arrive at your house.

45 Minutes: Take pictures before the ceremony.

30 Minutes: The parents of the bride and groom begin greeting guests while the rest of the wedding party takes their seats.

15 Minutes: You get your makeup retouched and prepare to enter the reception site with your new husband.

1 Minute: You proudly make your way to the wedding hall with your husband and enter to the site of your family and friends cheering for you. You proceed with your first dance as husband and wife... Smile... this is your moment!!!



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Super Foods Recommended

1. Yogurt and Keffir

These cultured foods contain healthful bacteria that aid immune function and calcium helps burn fat. Try using them as a base for a smoothie.

2. Beans and Lentils

You can reduce cholesterol while beefing up on antioxidants, folic acid and potassium. Try kidney, black, navy, pinto, chickpeas, soybeans, peas, and lentils.

3. Nuts and Seeds

You can't go wrong with a handful of nuts a day - walnuts, hazelnuts, almonds, macadamia, and pistachio nuts contain omega - 3 fats, which are great for your heart. Raw, unsalted and seeds are best.

4. Anything in the "Allium Family"

Garlics, onions, leeks, scallions, chives, and shallots can all help the liver eliminate toxins and carcinogens.

5. Hot Peppers

Both bell and chilli peppers contain antioxidants, have twice the vitamin C as citrus fruit, and work as great fat burners.

6. Sprouts

Numerous varieties of sprouts are great with any meal. They're great source of protein and vitamin C. Try adding them to any dish and your immune system will get a boost.

7. Green Foods

Wheat and barley grasses. They offer greater levels of nutrients than green leafy vegetables. They also help cholesterol, blood pressures and immune response.

8. Barley

This can be used as a breakfast cereal, in soups and stews, and as a rice substitute. Barley is also high in fiber, helping metabolize fats, cholesterol and carbohydrates.

9. Buckwheat: Seeds and Grains

Buckwheat is loaded with protein, high in amino acid, stabilizes blood sugar and reduces hypertension.

10. Acai fruit

This little berry is one of the most nutritious and powerful foods in the world!!



Tips

• **Venue**

- Make sure you have a good ratio of waiters to guests.
- Choose a venue that suits your wedding style.
- Try to choose a venue where you would not have to spend a lot on décor to make it beautiful.

• **Florist**

- Booking your venue prior to choosing your flowers is essential for knowing the number of arrangements required and the prominent colors of the venue.
- Check on the design philosophy of your florist, whether it's more modern or traditional.
- Ask to see samples of their work done by the same person who will be working on your wedding arrangements.
- Get an itemized quote from your florist.

• **Plan**

- Plan everything well ahead of time. It will save you a lot of effort and a lot of headache.
- While you might have several helping in the planning, there should be only one person who is ultimately responsible.
- The sooner you organize yourselves, the earlier you can book your suppliers and venue and maybe get great deals.
- Save any ideas you get from magazine in a scrapbook. It's a great idea to gather ideas.
- Keep in mind that the more interesting the idea, the simpler the design can be so as not to distract from the originality of the thought.



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More Tips

• **Sound & Light**

- Get speakers that are powerful enough for your party or else you will have poor sound quality.
- Quality of systems and speakers is the key to assure good quality music. So choose the speakers of the highest quality that your budget allows.
- Locate the speakers well so the music is evenly distributed.
- Make sure that the equipment you were promised is the actually used in your wedding.
- The more details you give regarding the event schedule, the better the lighting specialist can plan.
- Try to leave the right amount and kind of lighting to create the kind of atmosphere you're looking for.
- Plan for ambient light for getting better quality photographs.

• **Cards**

- See a sample of your invitation card before it goes to printing.
- If you have a specific theme for your event, try to incorporate it into the invitation card.
- Remember that your invitation card is the first thing that your invitees see in connection to your event.

• **Favors**

- If distributing favors, have them reflect both your responsibilities. It makes them more special that way.
- Decide if you want the favors to be distributed with the cards or at the wedding itself.

• **Catering**

- Make sure you understand in detail what the quoted price includes.
- The buffet (if you're having one) is probably the only thing that should not reflect your taste alone.
- Try to have a wide selection of food to cater to people of all sorts.
- Check if you can get your own alcohol, it will save you money.
- Inform your caterer with kind and age of people coming to your event.
- Arrange a sampling of the dishes you plan to have served.

• **Photographer**

- Provide the photographer with a detailed schedule of your event.
- Book your photographer as soon as you can.
- Try to have most of the pictures taken at the beginning of the event or wedding party while your make up still looks good.
- Make sure to have a list of the photos you'd like taken and gave the list to your photographer.

• **Bridal Bouquet**

- Try to design your bouquet in a way that it is not too heavy for you.
- If you wish to preserve the bouquet, you need to have a smaller one resembling the official one that you would toss.

• **Cake**

- Choose the number of layers and style you want for your cake.
- Dare to be daring with the style of your cake. People are so used to seeing traditional cakes.
- The cake topper can be the bride and groom themselves.

• **Seating**

- Consider having place cards if the number of guests permits.
- Have ushers to help with seating your guests, provided they are all well updated.
- Zoning is another option for seating arrangement.
- Having a diagram of the layout will help you greatly.

• **Style**

- You should have a particular theme for your event.
- Whatever style you decide on, make sure that you decide early on to be able plan well for it.

• **Budget**

- Prepare a budget before any planning takes place and try to stick on it.
- Always remember that prices are negotiable.
- Use your budget worksheet as a guide when shopping or talking to your suppliers.

• **Music**

- Decide early on the music to played, especially those at the beginning of the wedding.
- Your DJ can either make or break the party! Arrange a meeting with your DJ before the wedding and agree on the type of music to be played.
- Listen to the live performance of the bands you are interested in if possible, otherwise get an audio or videotape.
